ALASKAN WAY CONSTRUCTION MOVING NORTH OF PIKE IN DECEMBER

As early as December 2, Waterfront Seattle will expand its work area north of Pike Street in the footprint of the former viaduct to begin construction of the new Elliott Way. This road over the railroad tracks and carved into the hillside, will be a key connection between Alaskan Way and Belltown. Activities include establishing the work zone, mobilizing equipment, locating utilities, and removing asphalt and landscaping. In addition, we plan to replace the eastern segment of the Lenora Pedestrian Bridge in order to meet the appropriate grades of the new Elliott Way sidewalk and roadway. The Port of Seattle plans to perform maintenance activities on the elevator here. All of these activities require closure of the Lenora pedestrian bridge, including elevator access, starting as early as January 2, until it is connected to the new Elliott Way.

WORK ZONES

SCHEDULE AND HOURS

- Monday through Friday, 7 AM to 5 PM
- Occasional overnight and weekend work

PEDESTRIAN AND VEHICLE ACCESS

- No vehicle access impacts, all work will be in WSDOT's previous viaduct demolition work zone
- Pedestrian access will be maintained to all businesses and residences
- Closure of the Lenora Pedestrian bridge starts as early as January 2

PARKING AND LOAD ZONES

- On-street parking will be restricted between Pike and Pine streets and on Pine Street adjacent to the work zone
- Access to nearby parking garages will remain open

EQUIPMENT AND NOISE

- Expect construction equipment and vehicles moving in and out of the work zone from Pine St and Elliott Ave
- Construction trucks and equipment may be noisy, with the most significant noise coming from breaking and removing roadway pavement and from vacuum trucks locating utilities

- Private utility work on Pine Street east of Alaskan Way is scheduled to begin Monday, November 25, and anticipated to be completed in early December. Work hours are 7 AM to 4 PM.
