
TYPICAL CROSS SECTION






















- Ensure access for businesses, residents, and all modes of travel (transit, freight, cars, bicycles, pedestrians)

- Coordination with all public and private projects








A COLUMBIA ST AND ALASKAN WAY ROADWAY CONSTRUCTION BEGINS; PIER 62 COMPLETED



TYPICAL WORK ZONE - YEAR 1





- Early briefings to most affected stakeholders
- Ongoing briefings throughout construction efforts
- "Street team" outreach approach:

- Advanced notifications - Hotline staffed during active work: 206.499.8040

- Flyering - Refreshed website with construction focus

- Weekly email updates - Social media updates

- On-the-ground outreach - Physical wayfinding and informational banners

- Construction maps - Real time text updates





OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE





- Partnership between City and Friends of Waterfront Seattle to deliver a package of enhanced operations and maintenance:
 - Activities and events year round
 - Dedicated and specialized maintenance team
 - Managed spaces with full time concierge staff and private security
 - Additional concession and retail offerings
- Dedicated annual City budget of \$4.8 million (2023), private fundraising \$1-\$2 million
- Transparency and accountability to ensure the waterfront is a democratic and inclusive space
