PROJECT LEADERSHIP

- Partnership between City of Seattle Office of the Waterfront and Civic Projects and the Downtown Seattle Association (DSA)
- Builds on DSA's 2013 Pike Pine Renaissance Design Vision
- Achieves a key Waterfront Seattle objective: improve east-west connections between the waterfront and surrounding neighborhoods
- City of Seattle will construct improvements as a part of Waterfront Seattle construction

- Meets 3 to 4 times per year







GUIDING PRINCIPLES


- Reinforce the role of Pike and Pine as primary east-west pedestrian streets


TOTAL = \$37 - 40M*


Pike-Pine Renaissance Design and Construction Schedule:

- Begin 30% design phase August 2019
- Select public artist March 2020
- Complete 30% design and cost estimate April 2020
- Complete environmental review September 2020
- Complete 100% design September 2021
- Projected construction start date June 2022

THE NEW PIKE AND PINE EXPERIENCE

SAFER

Pike and Pine will be comfortable and predictable for all users, with shorter, more visible crosswalks, wider sidewalks, uniform light levels, protected bike lanes and positive street activity.



MORE DYNAMIC

Public seating and sidewalk cafes, plus programming, more greenery, active business frontages and iconic lighting will create places to linger and enjoy city life.

BETTER CONNECTED


Pike and Pine will have a more consistent character and identity from end to end. The connection to Capitol Hill over the freeway will be more welcoming, with wider sidewalks, higher rails, greenery and pedestrian lighting. The connection to Pike Place Market will feature curbless streets to calm traffic and welcome pedestrians.



- (5) Enhanced tree canopy















PINE STREET PLAZA - TIMELINE

2017

Pine St between 3rd Ave and 4th Ave is identified in the Pike/Pine Renaissance and Imagine Greater Downtown plans as an opportunity site

Back-in-angled parking is replaced with planters, bike lane, and painted plaza

2018

DSA + SDOT partner on light-layer activation with tables and chairs, games, food trucks, and daily ambassador staffing

Efforts put on pause in October

Work begins on a new Plaza Management Agreement

2019

Plaza Management Agreement is signed in September

Daily staffing and data gathering resumes


Phased roll-out of activation beginning with food trucks

2020

Pocket park is placed with benches and art installation

RFQ released for design and construction of parklet area

SITE MAP



- 1 The intended area for this scope is roughly 13'x100'. The installation will need to address roadway slope, stormwater drainage, and difference in curb height.
- 2 The plaza area is currently framed by a row of planter boxes. We are interested in replacement of these features that better distinguish the plaza area and are less prone to maintenance problems.
- 3 The plaza is flanked on both sides by entrances to the downtown light rail tunnel. Pedestrian traffic to and from the entrances should be incorporated in the design to ensure adequate clear paths of travel and capture the pedestrian energy.
- 4 A bike lane runs along the edge of the plaza and is buffered from the general travel lane. All features placed in the plaza need to take bike movement into account.
- 5- Space has been set aside for 1-2 food trucks which will be on-site twice daily. This area is not within the scope of this project.
- 6 The street surface is currently painted with a blue/yellow pattern which we would like to modify.



PROJECT BRIEF:

As part of enlivening the downtown core of Seattle, we're turning part of Pine Street Plaza at 3rd Ave + Pine St into an outdoor, public art gallery. We'll be placing 5 large display structures that are intended to hold 5'x5' vinyl sheets with printed images. Now we need 10 images to go on them, that's where you (and 9 others) come in.

REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. Signed artist contract outlining scope of work
- 2. Proposed image(s) for selection process, may be original or prior works
- 3. Finalized image in correct filetype and resolution for printing onto vinyl

TIMELINE/BUDGET

\$500 fee for use of the artwork


Will be displayed for 3 months, with option to extend depending on conversation with each selected artist. Vinyl print can be provided to each selected artist at the end of the installation period.




